Ulterior Noises brings together experimental work by Nqa Blayed and Billy J Burke, developed through the collective's creative projects.

Working between disciplines, with salvaged materials, pieces of modular furniture, corroded debris, and DIY electronics, this exhibition displays some of the different forms of markmaking we use in our practices.

Structures teeter on unconvincing foundations, their awkward forms tied together in a provisional circuit, made vulnerable by the connections that bind them. Billys paintings and assemblages leer into the disorienting soundscape, while Nqa's tiny follies lurk like silhouettes or cling like limpets on uncertain terrain.
