This body of work is a mash-up of the wobbly tactility afforded by both hand-made and digital art-making processes. The sculptures were made by emulating 3D printing, manually extruding silicone layer by layer, allowing the forms to organically emerge. The animated pieces, created through photogrammetry and 3D animation explore an alternative expression of tactile materials, where elasticity, surface quality and scale are mutable.
